Religious Discrimination In US Postal Service

Even though there have been recent federal laws passed applying to civil service employees which provide government employees the option of engaging in compensatory overtime work for time loss because of religious reasons, this new flextime concept does not apply to employees of the U.S. Postal Service since

they are not considered civil service employees.

Even though the newly enacted Federal Employees Flexible and Compressed Work Schedules Act of 1978 does not cover postal employees, they are covered by other amendments to the Civil Rights Act of 1964 which require both public and
