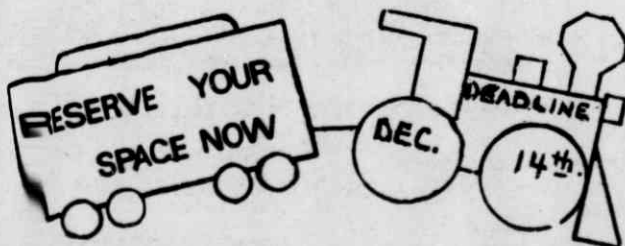

General Orly's straightforward statements elicited the overwhelming response in pledges.

The process leading to the evening's success actually began in mid-October when a meeting was held for a group of Jewish Community leaders. At that time concern was expressed for the 1980 Federation Campaign in light of a potential Community Capital Funds Drive in the Spring. Present at that meeting was Dr. Morry Lipton, a leader in the Charleston Jewish Community, who described the process by which his city's 1979 Federation campaign had increased 10% at the same time that three million dollars was raised for renovations and expansions of three synagogues and the Charleston JCC.

"The Federation drive helps people who are in need," said Dr. Lipton. "Just because we are fortunate enough to be able to build necessary facilities doesn't mean that the hurts or needs are any less."

Those present affirmed their intention to have a successful, increased 1980 Federation Men's Campaign and Alvin and Shelton agreed to share the chairmanship. Their initial efforts culminated in the success at Cafe Eugene.

(Note: Often it is the small things which add so much meaning. Three young men

from the community were engaged to be waiters and bus-boys for the dinner — Danny Levine, Robert Gleiberman and Lane Ostrow. They finished their work, received their promised pay and walked over to a small group of leaders who had remained after dinner to talk. "We want to do our part," the boys said, putting their hard earned money on the table. It was the most important \$50 of the evening.)

sion programs of the convention was a session with Esther Peterson, assistant to President Carter for consumer affairs. Programs featured new and innovative strategies for educational programming, leadership development and campaigning. The format was such that it allowed the participants to gain insight into areas of special interest and speak directly to women leaders who have developed creative responses to the challenges that must be faced. Other workshops during the Conference covered the topics of: Women's Plea for Soviet Jewry, The View from the Campus, The Energy Crisis, a solicitor training session, and a Shabbat study group.
