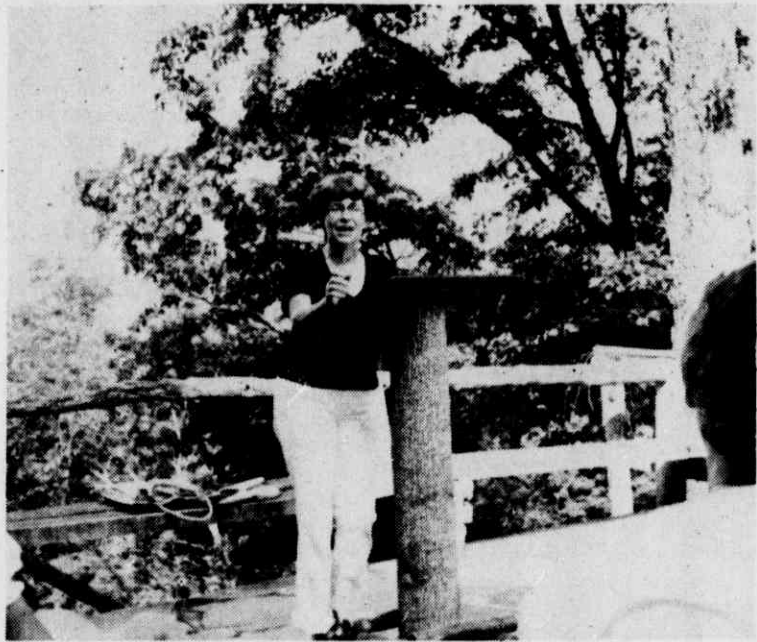
All Chai-Up guests participated in programs, services, onegs and get togethers. Free time was spent indulging in ping-pong, bridge games, tennis and socializing.

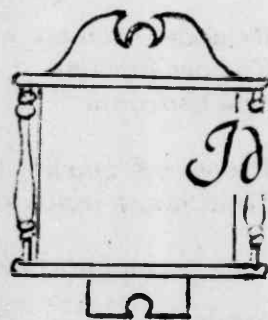
