### Personal Giving

minority child and his or her special needs in the school setting. Special time was devoted to the Jewish child to teach these community representatives about the Jewish religion and traditions and how this specifically affects this particular child.

On October 28 the Judaism Institute was held at Temple Israel. This evening was an integral part of the Workshop but was open to all members of both the Jewish and non-Jewish community. The evening began with a brief presentation by Rabbi Richard Rocklin who spoke about the various symbols in the synagogue and Judaism in general. All in attendance were then invited downstairs where members of Ha Lailah were stationed at different tables representing each Jewish holiday and other Jewish events. Each person was given a booklet explaining the various holidays and then were able to circulate around the room and see the various holiday symbols and ask questions. One of the more interesting aspects of the evening was the refreshment table. This table was laden with traditional foods prepared by the membership. What an interesting way to introduce the non-Jewish community to the many delicious Jewish foods. The last workshop will be held on November 4.
