The Israeli "Operation Peace for Galilee" in Lebanon, provided the pretext for a blurring of any significant differences between anti-Zionist and anti-Semitic calumnies in the media, and for a rash of anti-Semitic incidents throughout Western Europe.

Below is a partial list prepared by ADL's European office.

We presume that many incidents remain unreported.
