


The Jewish Monthly "The Magazine describes

Avraham Burg To Speak At **Community Forum**

Avraham (Avrum) Burg, social activist and leading peace advocate, will speak to the Charlotte Jewish Community on American - Israeli **Relations: The Current State of** Affairs. Mr. Burg works as a Consultant to the New Israel Fund on Relationships between Israeli Community groups and American Jews.

Avrum Burg is the son of Interior Minister Yosef Burg, who is the head of the National **Religious Party and has been** in the Israeli Cabinet longer than any other member. Avrum Burg is also a Leadership Fellow working on the Relationship between Zionism and Judaism. He is a student of Industrial Design at the Bezalel Art Academy.

His speech to the community will be on Tuesday, October 25 and 8:15 p.m. at Temple Beth El. The program will provide a question and answer period following his major remarks. A reception will be held in the social hall after the discussion. The program is sponsored by the Community Relations Committee of the Charlotte Jewish Federation.

Mr. Burg is a somewhat controversial figure on current Israeli policies. This program promises to be an educational experience which should spark a thought provoking discussion. We urge your attendance.
