back with us.

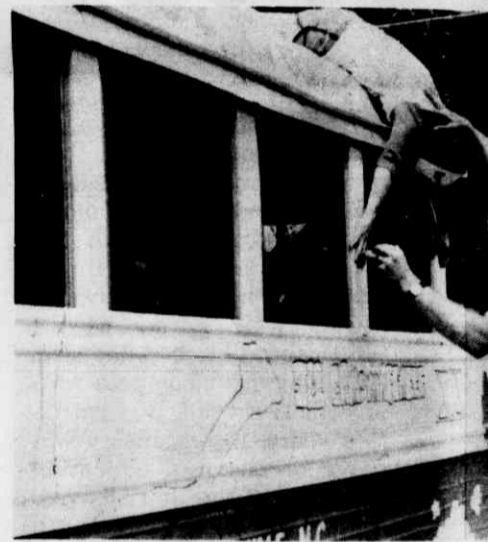

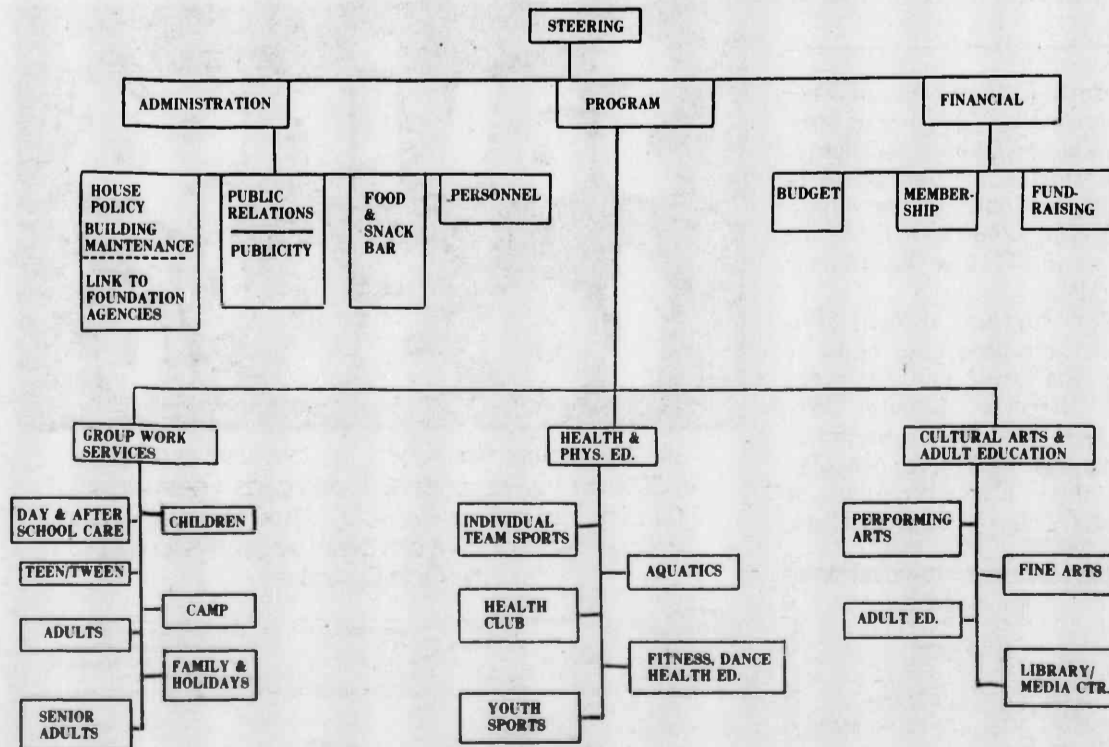
