Lisa Vernon, Educator at Temple Beth El, felt the reasons were clear. "Most adults are trying to get by on pediatric Judaism," she said.
"At best they received 3-5
hours a week of the equivalent of kindergarten to 5th grade Sunday school or Hebrew School. Then came two years to prepare for Bar or Bat Mitzvah and that was it. Now, as adults, most Jews are left with those grade school stories and half remembered information as the basis for trying to make sense out of our Jewishness. It's embarrassing, to say the least, especially when it comes to your own children. "It's not their fault. They didn't decide to be 5th grade drop-outs. It's the way the system of Jewish education has worked for years, and it's a pleasure to be part of a community effort to help adults make up for losses they suffered as kids."

The kinds of basic classes requested included: Basic information on Judaism starting with who is a Jew and moving on to symbols, customs, ceremonies, beliefs; basic Hebrew including prayers; Jewish music for services and for just singing; creating a Jewish home environment; Israeli dancing; an orientation to Shabbat services explaining the various prayers and customs.

Through the cooperation of all the Institutions, THE NEW JOINT ADULT IN-STITUTE will provide just exactly these kinds of courses in a six-week semester beginning Thursday, January 24 and continuing through Thursday, February 28. Each evening, 5 classes will be offered from 7:45 to 8:45 p.m. and five more, some duplicates, will be offered from 9 to 10 p.m. The full program is described on on this page.

"No prior knowledge of any kind will be assumed," said Rabbi Robert Seigel, who will teach one of the basic Judaism courses. "All the questions will come from the students to the teachers. That way no one has to sit in fear of being asked a question they can't answer unless, of course, the students stump the teacher."

The Institute will not ignore the needs and interests of those who feel they know the basics and want more advanced courses. In each of the two hours, a Rabbi will teach a more detailed curriculum. Rabbi Richard Rocklin will offer a class on Comparative Theology from a Jewish point of view while Rabbi Harold Krantzler, during the first hour of classes, will teach on The Great Books of Jewish (TANACH. History MISHNAH, GEMOREH,

The week following the conclusion of the Institute will be celebrated with a Purim Party. A second six-week Institute will begin on March 14.
