Jewish Singles To Hold "Sun & Fun" Weekend

An exciting weekend for Jewish singles, sponsored by Temple Israel of Norfolk, will again be held at the Cavalier Oceanfront Hotel complex in Virginia Beach, August 23-25. 
A list of available books has been compiled by one of our members, Jenny Rosenthal, who has a masters degree in library science and is presently the librarian at Temple Beth
