
Goldberg Recognized By UJA

Hebrew Academy Offers Home Start Program



Beginning this fall, the Hebrew Academy will be offering a unique educational enrichment program geared to all pre-school age children in the Piedmont. The Home Start program was conceived by Rabbi Hyman Chanover and consists of easy to read, beautifully illustrated, full color booklets created for each of the major Jewish holidays and the Sabbath. Included in the kits are corresponding play and learn magazines, parent handbook and cassette of Jewish songs and stories.

The program is being introduced to the Charlotte community by Roz Segal, vice president of education at the Hebrew Academy. She says, "This is the best Jewish program of its kind in the country. I believe that every Jewish parent should take the opportunity to look at this unique educational tool. A parent and pre-school child can, together, discover the beauty of Jewish ritual and prayers.

The total cost of the Home Start program is \$12.95 and includes participation in special Hebrew Academy Holiday Centers, set up when the holiday packets are picked up. Roz also says, "The Holiday Centers will provide an opportunity for the children to participate in arts and crafts, cooking and stories which are related to these materials. They will be available on specific afternoons in September, November, January, February, March and May."

The idea of bringing the Home Start program to Charlotte was born when board members began looking for ways to develop an education program which could be offered to the community at large. Eleanor Weinglass, Director of the Hebrew Academy says, "We want to involve all young childen in the excitement and celebration of our Jewish holidays.
