Chicken In **Red Wine**

Looking for a quick and tasty way to prepare chicken? This preparation takes a couple of minutes and is ready in about an hour. Serve on a bed of wide noodles. Serves 6 adults.

2 fryers cut into eighths 2 cloves garlic, crushed 1 pkg. onion soup 11/2 cups dry red wine 11/2 cups water

Sprinkle garlic on top of chicken. Pour onion soup powder on top of chicken. Mix wine with water. Pour over

chicken. Bake 1 hour at 350 degrees. Baste. Add water as necessary.

Sweet & Sour Fish

This is an old recipe from a late friend. It should be served cold, either as an appetizer or a main dish, with cole slaw and potato salad.

3 lbs. whitefish or trout, cut 2 tsps. cinnamon into two-inch pieces 1 apple, cut up (medium)

1 small onion

1 tsp. ginger

5 pepper corns 1 bay leaf

1/2 cup yellow raisins

Wash and salt fish. Let stand for about 1 hour. Put remaining ingredients into pot. Place fish on top of ingredients and cover with water. Add 1/2 cup brown sugar. Cook for 3/4 to 1 hour. Add lemon juice to taste.

"Meatballs"

Every family these days has either family members or friends who are vegetarians. These "Meatballs" are a nutritious, protein-filled main course. They can be served over whole wheat or regular noodles.

2 hard-boiled eggs 1 small onion, chopped salt, pepper to taste 1/2 cup wheat germ 1/2 cup ground walnuts

1/3 cup bread crumbs 2 raw eggs corn oil 16 ozs. tomato sauce 1 tblsp. water

Finely grate hard-boiled eggs. Add all ingredients except last three to it. Mix well. Form into small balls. Brown in hot corn oil. Add tomato sauce and water. Simmer covered for ½ hour.

Beignets

½ cup boiling water 2 tblsps. vegetable shortening

1/4 cup sugar 1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 cup evaporated milk ½ pkg. yeast

1/4 cup warm water 1 egg, beaten 3¾ cups sifted flour 1 cup sifted sugar confectioners'

Pour boiling water over shortening, sugar and salt. Add milk and let stand until warm. Dissolve yeast in ¼ cup warm water; add yeast and egg to milk mixture. Stir in about 2 cups flour and beat well. Add enough additional flour to make a soft dough. Place in greased bowl; grease top of dough and cover with waxed paper and a dry cloth. Place in refrigerator until ready to use.

Roll dough to ¼ inch thickness. Work quickly, so dough does not rise before frying. Cut into 21/2-inch squares. Heat deep fat to 360 degrees in heavy skillet or deep fryer. Drop squares into fat a few at a time, allowing room for expansion. Brown on one side and then the other, turning only once. Drain on absorbent paper. Sprinkle with confectioners' sugar while still warm, or shake beignets in brown bag with sugar. Serve immediately. Makes about 30 beignets.
