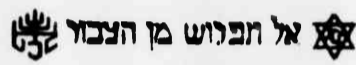

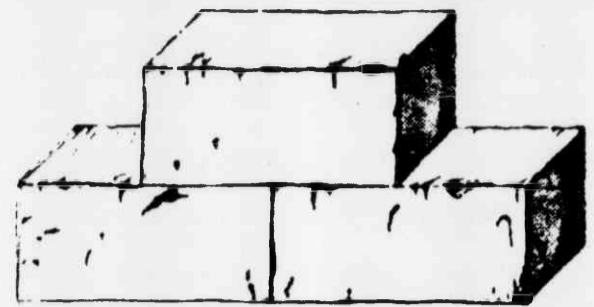
Blood Drive
