Yiddish Vinkl Is Now In Second Year

The Yiddish Vinkl, sponsored by the Jewish Community Center, had its opening session in February, 1984 at Temple Beth Shalom and has been meeting once a month ever since.

The Vinkl offers classes in Yiddish conversation and reading; socializing over "ah glezzelleh tay" and refreshments, as well as a varied program of Yiddish culture.

Baila Pransky coordinated the first year and a half of the Vinkl with able assistance from Lyba Pollard, Raizel Luski and Jenny Rosenthal. The Vinkl started with two classes taught by Gedalia Ackerman and Avram Luski, but quickly grew to five classes as close to 50 Yiddishists began to regularly attend. Classes are:

- Beginners (onfeingers) Yiddish with Baila Pransky and Sholom Goozner

- Intermediate (mit tel) Yiddish with Raizel Luski and Gedalia Ackerman

- Advanced Yiddish (gor kenners) with Avram Luski

Vinkl programs have featured sing-a-longs with guitarist Moishe Bienstock; slide presentations on Poland and the Yiddish Theatre; readings by Avram Luski; concerts by saxophonist Martin Travis, violinist Sam Citron, pianist Murray Rosen and song stylist Jack Karro.

Elkie and Stan Tulman are now the capable coordinators of the Vinkl. The next meeting will be held on April 9, 7:30 p.m. at Temple Beth El. All interested Yiddishists are cordially invited to participate in a wonderful warm atmosphere of Yiddishkeit.
