Jewish Social Services has entered an agreement with the Jewish Community Center to rent the JCC van for the use of seniors every Thursday. Seniors may use the van for doctor's appointments, grocery shopping, visiting, or other usages. In this way, it is hoped transportation will be expanded for many persons who are dependent on others for rides.

To take advantage of this service, seniors should call Jewish Social Services at 366-5007 several days in advance to reserve space. Passengers will pay \$1 per one-way trip; Jewish Social Services will subsidize the other costs, reimbursing the JCC for the driver's time and the cost of mileage.

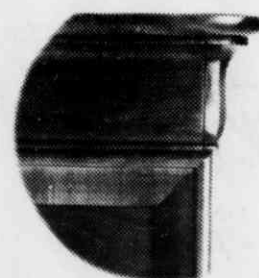
