

David Barman, son of Mr. and Mrs. Marvin Barman, has been selected to march with the Garfield Cadets Drum and Bugle Corps this summer.



He also has been elected to the N.C. Board of Directors of the National Society to Prevent Blindness.

Dr. James J. Bedrick, an ophthalmologist sub-specializing in diabetic eye disease, laser and microsurgery of the eyes, and Assistant Clinical Professor of Medicine, UNC School of Medicine, is the co-author of "Diabetic Retinopathy," a chapter in the new text "Clinical Diabetes Mellitus."
