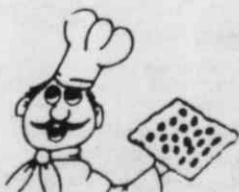

# Meichels

We still have many more weeks of hot weather and we all look to ways of keeping out of the kitchen or at least heating it up as little as possible. The following recipes may help.



## Kebab

Kebabs, a popular form of rolled, grilled chopped meat in the Middle East, are delicious grilled on a barbeque grill. They can be served on hot dog rolls or in pita bread. You must refrigerate the prepared kebabs a few hours before cooking.

2 lbs. ground lamb  
1 large onion, chopped

2 tbs. chopped parsley  
1 tsp. cumin

Mix all the ingredients together. Form into patties the size and shape of your ring finger. Place in a pan, cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for a few hours to allow flavors to mix. Remove when ready to barbeque. Makes 20-25 kebabs. Serve 4-6 kebabs per person.

## Spanish Rice with Hot Dogs

For a really quick meal, try Spanish rice with hot dogs. This is a good family supper, to which you need add a large tossed salad, some applesauce and perhaps brownies for dessert.

1/2 stick pareve margarine  
1 clove garlic, diced

12 oz. package hot dogs, sliced  
1 beef bouillon cube, dissolved  
in 1 1/4 cups hot water

1 large, chopped green pepper  
1 medium chopped red pepper  
1/4 lb. mushrooms, diced  
2 stalks celery, diced

1 16-oz. can tomato sauce  
dash pepper  
1/4 cup pre-cooked rice

Melt margarine. Brown vegetables and garlic. Stir occasionally. Add remaining ingredients, except rice. Mix well. Bring to a boil. Simmer 5 minutes. Add rice. Cover and cook 10 minutes or until rice is tender. Serves 4.

## Fruit Salad Dressing

Fresh fruit salads are excellent as desserts or as main dishes for a light luncheon. Here is a dressing that is good mixed with fresh peaches, apples, blueberries, pineapple and bananas.

1/2 cup sugar  
1 tbs. margarine  
2 well-beaten eggs  
juice of 1/2 lemon

juice of 1 orange  
pinch of lemon peel  
1 cup whipping cream, whipped

Cook sugar, margarine, eggs, juices and lemon peel on top of double boiler, stirring until thick. Refrigerate. Just before serving, mix with the whipped cream and toss over fruit salad.

## Papal Policy Toward Jews Being Studied

The Pope's historic visit to the Rome Synagogue prompts an announcement by the Memorial Foundation for Jewish Culture that a study of papal policy toward Jews in the Middle Ages has been conducted by Professor Shlomo Simonsohn of Tel-Aviv University with the financial support of the Foundation.

"The purpose of the study," Foundation President Philip M. Klutznick says, "is to uncover the history of the relations between the leadership of the Christian Church in Europe and the Jewish Diaspora throughout a thousand years."

The project has concentrated on papal documents about Jewish people in Europe in the Middle Ages and documents from the Vatican Archives on the papal policy concerning Jews in the Middle Ages up to the Reformation and the Council of Trent.

The systematic collection and publication of the documents is part of a full-scale program of scholarly research being carried out at the Diaspora Research Institute of Tel-Aviv University with the active support of the Memorial Foundation.

Among the accomplishments of the program are work on A Documentary History of the Jews of Italy, directed by Professor Simonsohn; Italia Judaica, a multi-volume bibliography and historical gazetteer; and 29 other publications.

"The Jewish community in Italy is the oldest in Europe," Dr. Jerry Hochbaum, Foundation executive director, observes. "It predates the destruction of the second Temple. Yet the historical records of Italian Jewry have never been investigated systematically. The Foundation-supported research at Tel-Aviv University seeks to correct this."
