TEL AVIV (JTA) - The Mexican Ambassador to Israel presented decorations and honorary certificates to members of the Israel Defense Force delegation which went to Mexico to provide aid to persons injured in the earthquake in Mexico City a year ago. The ceremony was held at the Ambassador's residence in Herzlia Pituah.

JERUSALEM (JTA ) The tiny Japanese community of Jerusalem grew by seven this summer when a group from Japan came to study He brew at the Rothberg School for Overseas Students at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. It is believed that this was the first time a group from Japan came to the university for the specific purpose of studying Hebrew. The oldest student was 80 -years-old and the youngest was 27. They all said it was difficult to learn Hebrew, but that they enjoyed themselves. One woman had already studied some Hebrew in Japan.
JERUSALEM (JTA) - Hebrew University archaeologists digging south of the Carmel range have uncovered the remains of a winery some 1,500 years old. It is located at Ramat Hanadiv, near the modern winery operated in Zichron Yaacov. No samples were found. Other discoverie in the region date from the Roman-Byzantine periods. They include a massive Roman structure which may have been a fortress overlooking the ancient city of Caesarea on the coast.
TEL AVIV (JTA) - El Al, Israel's national airline, may be sold to private investors. According to the report, the sale is under consideration by the Ministers of Finance, Transport and Economic Affairs, who are discussing it with Los Angeles businessman William Beltsberg. The government-owned air carrier has an accumulated debt estimated at $\$ 340$ million.
