Chai members sharing Academy's Shabbat period with kindergarten children



S.A.T. REVIEW CLASS/COLLEGE PREP WORKSHOP

Prospective College Students Beginning in January the JCC will offer a S.A.T. review class to prepare prospective college students to take the Scholastic Aptitude Test.

SHERRY LEBLANG will be instructing the math review portion for the review course. Sherry graduated magna cum laude from Wake Forest. She holds the M.B.A. degree from Winthrop College and is a former stock broker. She has taught college business, economics and math at Queens College and Pteifter College. She taught the 1986 Spring S.A.T. Review at Queens.

The comprehensive math review will cover fractions. percentages, algebra basics, geometry fundamentals, and word problems. Test taking strategy sessions are also included.

GENERAL INFORMATION:
