### "People-Power Weekend" to Explore Medical Ethics with Dr. Lincourt

Dr. John Lincourt, distinguished Professor of Philosophy at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte and Preceptor of Medical Ethics at Charlotte Memorial Hospital and Medical Center, will be the featured scholar-in-residence for Temple Israel's Second Annual "People-Power Weekend," to be held February 13-14. Such contemporary bioethical topics as patients' rights and health-care providers' duties, allocation of scarce and expensive medical resources, and issues of death and dying will be the focus of discussion throughout the weekend.

Professor Lincourt is a nationally acclaimed authority in the field of medical ethics and has received numerous honors for his teaching. They include the Outstanding Educators of America Award (twice), the International Who's Who in Education Award, and, most recently, the NCNB Award for

Teaching Excellence. In addition to distinguishing himself as an educator during his twenty years of teaching, Professor Lincourt has also published extensively. His work includes articles with such provocative titles as "Benevolent Deception in Family Medicine" and "Schizophrenese as Semiosis."

Professor Lincourt, whose approach is practical and "case-oriented," will offer two presentations — one on Friday evening following Shabbat Services and the second on Saturday afternoon preceding a buffet supper. A series of roundtable discussions, in which participants will work together to resolve some knotty bioethical dilemmas, are also planned for Saturday afternoon following services and lunch. The weekend promises to afford participants a stimulating opportunity for study and fellowship. For more information, please contact Temple Israel, 376-2796.
