Steve Garfinkel is an attorney with the law offices of Alan Gordon and is a member of the "J". Steve is looking for a racquetball game.


Stefani Penkney is project manager with Odell Associates. She's married and has a cat. Stefani moved to Charlotte one month ago from Houston, Texas.
