The Lion of Judah-Pacesetters event of the Women's Division of the Charlotte Jewish Federation was held Sunday evening, Nov. 1 at the home of Leon and Sandra Levine. Tovah Feldshuh, an acclaimed actress of Broadway, television and feature films, was the guest speaker.

Tovah shared her personal experiences of traveling to Israel with her husband during the time she was pregnant with their first child. Tovah insisted they make the trip, which was her husband's first to Israel.

She recalled their visit to the Western Wall, and how they had written a prayer for the good health of their unborn child. Together they placed their special note in one crack of the Wall.

When visiting Yad Vashem, she went into the Hall of Records and discovered what had happened to the Feldshuh family of Vienna. Most of her relatives had perished in the Holocaust. Miraculously, one cousin escaped and made his way to Israel, where he served in all the wars. Tovah was reunited with that family. Recently, her cousin's son was

in Texas being trained by the U.S. Air Force to fly Israeli aircraft.

Emily Zimmern, president of Women's Division, in welcoming all to the program, spoke of the importance of women giving at the leadership levels.
