Now that winter is here, there is nothing like a hot bowl of soup to begin a meal, or to accompany a sandwich for lunch.



BEEF-BARLEY SOUP

- 1 lb. short ribs 2 soup bones 8 cups water 1/2 cup lima beans 1 cup barley
- 2 carrots, scraped & sliced 1 stalk celery, sliced 1 large onion, whole 2 potatoes, diced salt & pepper to taste

Put short ribs, bones, and water in a 4-quart pot. Bring to boil and skim off the top. Add the remaining ingredients. Cover and simmer 21/2 hours. Add more salt and pepper if desired. Can be frozen. Excellent reheated. Serves 6.

In the kosher kitchen, one can prepare either a dairy lasagna or one made with meat. Try both to see which best pleases your family. Serve either with vegetable soup and cole slaw to make a complete meal.

DAIRY LASAGNA

8 oz. lasagna noodles	2 tbsp. water	
1 16 oz. can tomato sauce	2 cups cottage cheese	
1 tbsp. vegetable oil	¹ / ₂ tsp. oregano	
1/2 lb. muenster cheese	, grated	

Cook noodles according to package directions. Mix tomato sauce with oil and water. Grease a 9 x 13-inch pan. Layer noodles, cottage cheese, tomato sauce, grated cheese and oregano, and repeat until all ingredients are used up. Bake at 375 degrees for 25 minutes. Serves 5-6.

BEEF LASAGNA

8 oz. lasagna noodles	1 medium onion, diced
1 lb. ground beef	oil
1 clove garlic, minced	16 oz. tomato sauce
1 green pepper, cut into thin strips	¹ / ₄ cup water
1/4 lb. mushrooms, sliced	oregano pinch of basil

Cook noodles according to package directions. Brown meat, onions, garlic, peppers and mushrooms in oil. Add tomato sauce, water, oregano and basil. Simmer for 5 minutes. In a greased 9 x 13-inch pan, layer noodles and sauce, ending with sauce. Bake at 375 degrees for 30 minutes.


