Howard and Saxe To Exhibit Photos

At the opening reception, June 5, 2:30-4 p.m. in the Speizman Galleries, Shalom Park, Jerry Howard and Allen B. Saxe will greet guests and be happy to talk about their photographs.

Both are avid amateur photographers and have lived in Charlotte about three years. Both are members of the Jewish Community Center and have been affiliated with various educational institutions.

Jerry Howard came to Charlotte with his wife Helene, from Stonybrook, New York as a retired high school guidance counselor. The Howards quickly became involved in the Charlotte community in general and in the Charlotte Jewish community in particular. Jerry is currently Vice-President of Education at Temple Beth El V'Shalom.

An uncle, Job Goodman, an art instructor at the New School in New York City, taught many of the famous such as Jackson Pollack. The program Mr. Goodman was affiliated with was part of the WPA artist's project during the depression years. It was this uncle who aroused Jerry's interest in art.

Jerry has been taking photographs seriously for fifteen years. He commented on what he looks for and tries to attain in his photos: "What fascinates me most are buildings, design and shades of color." This is evident in his works from around the world — panorama to close-ups. He doesn't use a tripod, just a steady hand and slow film to achieve his breathtaking results.

Allen Saxe moved to Charlotte in 1985 from Florida and is married to Jessica Schorr Saxe. They have two children, Eddie and Kafia. Currently he is an instructor of urban studies at Johnson C. Smith University. As a member of Temple Israel, he and his family are active in many phases of temple life. Allen's interest in Judaism spans the ages from ancient observance to contemporary rituals. He is especially proud that he has taught a large group to blow the shofar; they perform simultaneously at Temple Israel services.

Figure studies and portraiture are Allen's specialty. The photographs he will be displaying at this time will be from a recent trip to Kenya. The clarity of the images and jewel-tone colors will amaze the viewer. Be sure to see the majestic peacock from a Kenya game reserve and the tribal "Masai" in full regalia. Children will especially enjoy the lions, zebras and giraffes.
