

Rebbe Adds New Dimension To the Kosher Kitchen

In a special address to Jewish women before Rosh Hashanah, the revered world Jewish leader, Rabbi Menachem M. Schneerson, Lubavitcher Rebbe Shlita, launched a new campaign which adds a new meaning to the kosher kitchen.

The Rebbe requested that a Pushke (charity box) be installed in every Jewish kitchen. "The act of charity while preparing food for yourself symbolizes our concern for the ones who are in need. Since the

kitchen is the place where we prepare our meals, it is only fitting that we express our concern in a practical way, which is given to the hungry," the Rebbe said.

The annual pre-Rosh Hashanah address draws thousands of women from all over the country to the Lubavitch Headquarters in Crown Heights, Brooklyn. The talk includes important lessons in Torah and practical instructions in Jewish life.

TEL AVIV (JTA) — Researchers from the Energy and Infrastructure Ministry's geological survey have recently discovered unusually large concentrations of gold in the southern region of the Arava.

GENEVA (JTA) — Swiss authorities have ruled that neo-Nazis are unwanted on Swiss territory, and are prohibited from entering the country, despite the fact that Switzerland has no written law prohibiting racist and anti-Semitic propaganda.

TEL AVIV (JTA) — Libyan leader Moammar Gadhafi said that he would pay \$1 million annually to the approximately 21,000 Palestinian civil servants in the West Bank and Gaza Strip who will no longer be receiving salaries from Jordan.

Gadhafi criticized King Hussein's recent measures to sever Jordan's administrative and financial ties to the West Bank. Gadhafi encouraged residents of the territories to continue their 9-month-old uprising.

NEW YORK (JTA) — The eastern regional manager of Hyundai Motor America, accused in separate lawsuits of making anti-Semitic remarks and discriminating against a Jewish auto dealer, "is no longer with the company."

PHILADELPHIA (JTA) — The U.S. team participating in the Olympics in Seoul, South Korea, includes eight athletes and four coaches who previously participated in the World Maccabiah Games in Israel, according to Larry Needle, spokesman for the U.S. Committee Sport For Israel, which coordinates the U.S. Maccabiah teams.

NEW YORK (JTA) — Mazon, a Jewish response to hunger, allocated grants totaling \$255,000 to 33 Jewish, non-Jewish and interfaith groups in the United States and other countries working to aid the poor, sick and homeless.
