In Haifa, the children did Israeli dancing and in Masada,

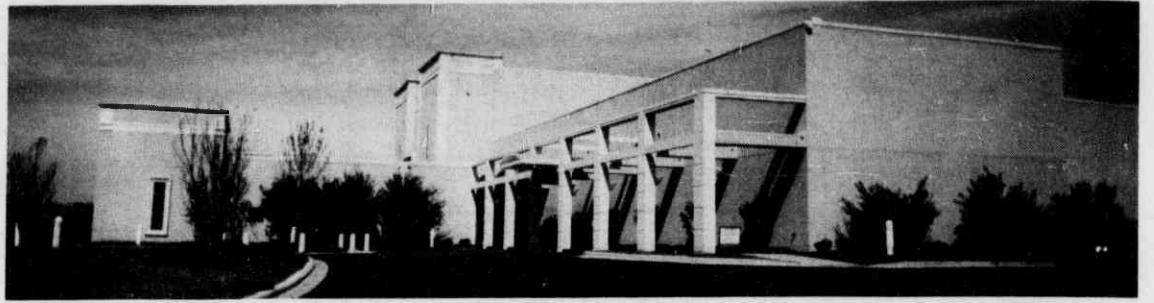

## Consolidated High School Salutes Honor Students

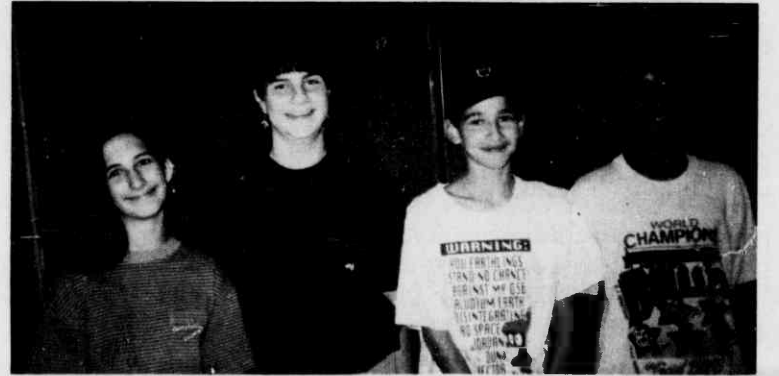
