One hundred representatives from Reform Temple Youth Groups in the Mid-Atlantic Region gathered to discuss and exchange ideas, attend workshops and services, and deal with leadership techniques in creating a successful youth group. It was certainly interesting in sharing our ideas.
- 3. Our Youth group leaders held training workshops for those members unable to attend the above. The work shops concentrated on the right and wrong ways in building LIBERTY dealing with the organization of the Board to recruiting new members.
- 4. LIBERTY participated in the 4th Annual High Holiday Hunger Project. Following the traditions of our texts, and the lead of the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism, the National Federation of Temple Youth, of which LIBERTY is a part, took on the challenge of helping to feed the hungry people in our community. We handed out paper bags supplied by HarrisTeeter on our Rosh Hashanah services asking congregants to return them on our Yom Kippur services filled with food, symbolically that which would not have been eaten during the fast.

The bags did not stop coming in! We collected 260 bags! The task now was to place all the food into boxes! It was a great feeling to see such a successful and worthwhile cause. This hunger project will be reported back to the Religious Action Center that we collected 3,600 lbs, almost 2 tons! Even after all the hard work of unpacking and packing the satisfaction of seeing what we had achieved was very rewarding. We even took the bags back to HarrisTeeter so that they could be recycled!

The Knesset House Committee has prepared new legislation intended to grant newlyweds more flexibility in choosing a last name. Under the bill, which was submitted to the Knesset for a first reading, recently married couples will be permitted to continue to use their pre-marriage last name. In addition, couples will be able to elect to adopt the female's last name.
