#### COMMUNITY CAMPAIGN REACHES ALL TIME RECORD OF \$1.5 MILLION

The 1997 Community Campaign stands at a record breaking \$1,550,776. That's \$49,000 away from reaching this year's goal of \$1.6 million dollars. The campaign is already at an all time high for the Jewish community in Charlotte, 18% ahead of the 1996 campaign.

"Obviously we are thrilled with the total to date," said Bill Gorelick, Campaign Chair. "We would however, like to make the goal which is certainly achievable at this point."

The progress and pace of the campaign is well ahead of where

it was this time last year. "Those who have not yet made a contribution need to know that every dollar counts." said Marvin Goldberg, Executive Director of the Jewish Federation. "Each dollar we raise enables us to do more for the Jewish community here in Charlotte and to assist Jews in need around the world."

The 1996 campaign raised \$1.4 million. To date, this year's campaign has already generated \$150,000 more than was raised

"We should be very proud of what we have accomplished thus

far," continued Goldberg. "Right now we are focusing our efforts on finishing the campaign and closing the remaining 'open gifts.' Our campaign is about building community. Each time a donor makes a gift to the campaign they are directly expressing their desire to stand up and be counted as a Jew who is committed to making difference. We hope that all of our contributors recognize importance of what they do and what an impact they are
