New Vaccination Can Arrest Juvenile Diabetes Say Researchers at Hadassah Medical Organization

In a major breakthrough, a new vaccine developed at the Weizmann Institute and researched at the Hadassah Diabetes Center at Ein Kerem in Israel, has been shown to be effective in treating the devastating effects of juvenile diabetes. Data on the vaccine, which can arrest the effects of the disease and also avert the need for insulin injection, will be published in the next issue of the prestigious medical journal, Lancet

Juvenile diabetes (Type 1 diabetes mellitus) is a disease in which an individual's white blood cells attack beta-cells in the pancreas and destroy them, resulting in a depletion of insulin in the blood. Regular self-injection of insulin prevents death, but does not entire-

ly prevent the appearance of severe complications resulting from the disease, which may include blindness and other serious eye prob-lems, kidney failure (leading to dialysis), and difficulties of the nervous system.

A research team headed by Prof. mar Raz, Director of the Itamar Raz, Director of the Hadassah Diabetes Center in Ein Kerem, treated 31 patients with juvenile diabetes. Fifteen of them received the vaccination and 16 others were given a placebo. After ten months, it was found that in those patients who were vaccinated the disease was arrested, while the condition of the patients receiving a placebo showed no such effects. research demonstrated that in

patients treated with the new vacpatients treated with the new vac-cine the beta-cells were preserved, while in untreated patients com-plete destruction of beta-cells was diagnosed," comments Prof. Raz. "Moreover," he points out, "treat-ment with the new vaccine not only maintained the level of production of insulin but even improved the function of insulin-

producing cells."

Prof. Raz adds that in addition to the actual clinical results for the vaccine, the research provides proof that we have the capability to safely take material from the laboratory level and successfully determine the correct dosage, time and administration interval for optimal
