Sonia Peltzer

Sally Schrader has made numer-ous contributions to the Charlotte

Jewish community over the years. As the first woman president of Temple Beth El (and the first woman president of any temple in Charlotte) she not only broke ground for the future leadership of women in the Jewish community, she also merged the two existing Reform congregations at the time (Temple Beth El and Congregation



congregation. She was also instru-mental in helping settle Soviet Jewish immigrants through the Charlotte Joint Russian Charlotte Joint Russian Immigration Program beginning in early 1974. During her thousands of hours devoted to this organiza-tion, Sally became a friend, mother, advocate and nursemaid to dozens of families settling in a new coun-try. In many cases, these personal ties have remained close for over 25 years.
