Serving as an umbrella for the Charlotte Jewish community, the Federation carefully examines local and overseas priority needs allocates accordingly.



Charlotte community is able to designate \$201,000 to meet the specific needs of Jews in the former Soviet Union, Argentina and Israel as well as assist our community Partnership Hadera-Eiron.
