CJDS Wildlife Habitat Enhanced by Gift from Barry Klemons

Imagine sitting behind your desk at work and receiving the following phone call from a fifth-grader at Charlotte Jewish Day School:

Student: "I'm from Charlotte Jewish Day School, and I saw some benches at Camp Mindy that have your company's name on them. I went to your website, but I did not see any benches for sale. Do you still sell benches?"

Business Owner: "How many of these benches are you looking for, and what will they be used for?"

Student: "They will be used for our school's wildlife habitat so people can enjoy the scenery around the creek that runs through Shalom Park. I would like each bench to be a yard and a half long and would like to get a price for four or five benches. How much are they?"

Business Owner: "I am very impressed with your knowledge. I will be glad to donate six benches for your school's wildlife habitat."

This was the conversation that transpired between Joel Truzman and Barry Klemons, owner of Archadeck of Charlotte.

This year's fifth grade curricu-

lum includes a study of natural habitats. As part of the process, the students formed committees to plan the construction of a habitat in Shalom Park. They were instructed to use the Internet to research cost, materials, and availability of the items they would like to include in the habitat, and Joel was responsible for choosing a design for benches that would be appropriate for outdoor use. When he could not find a suitable design on the Internet, Joel decided to call the company whose name he had seen on the benches in the covered basketball area at Camp Mindy.

Mr. Klemons was so impressed with the way Joel presented himself that he not only donated six attractive sturdy benches that blend in with the natural beauty of the area, but also included a matching table as well. The benches and new table are currently located by the old picnic tables, near the creek, for all to relax and enjoy a view of our work in progress along the stream.

Again, thank you to Barry Klemons and Archadeck of Charlotte for this generous gift to our school's wildlife habitat. ☆
