Imagine living in a country that has arid land, sparse water resources, and limited trees. This was the condition of the land the chalutzim (pioneers) found when they came to rebuild our homeland more than 100 years ago. However, through the work of Jewish National Fund, these conditions dramatically changed. Planting trees, developing reservoirs, and building roads are just some of the important projects that JNF has done to enhance the land of Israel.

Traditionally, funding for these projects has been collected in the Blue Box," the JNF tzedakah box. This year Charlotte Jewish pre-schools and religious schools

were visited by Blue Bob Box and each child was given a blue tzadakah box of his or her own. Not long after the visit, the kids came back with their boxes full of tzedakah, and today we can announce that more than \$1,700 was raised to plant trees in Israel. 
