The grants span the entire state and support a wide variety of programs. Whether helping to provide meals and emergency shelter in Nashau, or assisting advocacy efforts in Asheville, MAZON grants seek to achieve both short- and long-term solutions to hunger. North Carolina ranks ninth in the nation in the percentage of

people living in food insecure households, meaning that they have insufficient financial resources to meet basic nutritional needs. According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, over 35 million Americans, including over 12 million children, are hungry or on the verge of hunger.

MAZON granted a total of \$1,471,000 to 139 hunger relief organizations in the United States, Israel and other countries this fall.

"For 22 years, MAZON has worked to bring critical relief to families in need," said MAZON President Dr. H. Eric Schockman.

"Our grantees and partners nationwide help make this possible, and we salute them for their visionary leadership and tireless effort."
