Secondly, we shall examine contemporary (and controversial) issues in American life and society that Judaism affects.

What kinds of issues will we be looking at? Abortion, same-sex marriage, religion in the public sphere, environmentalism, welfare, the War on Terror, just to name a few. In each presentation, Poelvoorde will sketch out how the issue emerges in American life and politics, what the traditional Jewish sources suggest as a starting point towards the issue, and how the various Jewish denomina-

tions have come to formulate their positions. The discussion, debate and argument will follow.
