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# Shavuot Festivity at Ohr HaTorah to Celebrate the Children

The holiday of Shavuot commemorates the giving of the Torah by God at Mount Sinai 3,321 years ago. The giving of the Torah at Sinai is considered the most historic event in Jewish narration, and it is seen as the marriage between God and the people of Israel. The very existence of Judaism today is directly linked to this milestone event which transformed the Jewish people forever.

According to the Midrash, the superstars of this amazing event were the children. God had asked Moses for credible guarantors for the safekeeping of the Torah and accepted only the children who will ensure that the Torah will be kept, revered, observed, and most of all, transmitted from generation to generation.

Ohr HaTorah will celebrate this Shavuot with the children taking the center stage at the morning service on Friday, May 29. During the service, Yitro (Jethro) is read; it describes the story of the giving of the Torah including the reading of the Ten Commandments.

There will be a festive dairy Kiddush luncheon after the service. One of the remarkable customs that has been popularized over the years is the eating of dairy foods such as cheesecake or cheese blintzes on Shavuot. This custom is based that Jews first began to observe kosher dietary laws with the giving of the Torah, and the most readily available foods to them at the time were milk and cheese.

The Ohr HaTorah Shavuot service is open to the entire community. The program will begin at 11 AM and will feature the reading of the Ten Commandments and delicious dairy foods for young and old.
