

receive the recognition and funding given her male, Orthodox counterparts in the Gezer Regional Council.

From her beginnings as a Reform Jewish kid growing up in Michigan, with Zionist genes in the family (her mother was a lifelong Hadassah member) to working on Kibbutz Gezer and ultimately becoming its rabbi, Miri Gold's story is significant, timely, and filled with unique insights into contemporary Israel. She will share with us the challenges and triumphs of religion, politics, and life in the Jewish state.

Temple Beth El Celebrates Shavuot with Confirmation




