In it, Allen outlines the simple philosophy underlying his vision. "I wanted nice dishes, nice silverware and no lines, and no trays. I wanted people to be seated and served." This vision has made the Dilworth Soup Kitchen a place where guests enjoy a nourishing meal along with a warm welcome from volunteer wait staff, kitchen workers, and community friends.


