

Jewish Federation of Greater Charlotte Allocates \$3,027,089* to Help Jews in Need in Charlotte, Israel and Worldwide

The Jewish Federation of Greater Charlotte is the thread that runs through the fabric of our Jewish community connecting us all. Giving *tzedakah* to the Federation has its roots in early Jewish history. In small towns and large cities, donations were given to a communal *chuppah* as an expression of devotion to the entire Jewish people. It demonstrates a love of community that is without limitation, a proud statement of commitment to our individual community and to every individual Jew.

Federation supports programs for Jews in need in Charlotte, Israel and throughout the world. By providing food for the hungry and counseling for the troubled, spearheading rescue and relief efforts for isolated Jews in distressed regions and funding innovative Jewish educational initiatives, the Jewish Federation creates a sense of community for more than 12,000 Jewish residents in Charlotte.

In a year when many non-profits are reporting reductions in their annual fundraising, the Jewish Federation's 2010 Annual Campaign is up 1% from the previous year due to the extraordinary cornerstone gift and the 19.3% challenge made by Sandra and Leon Levine. Their remarkable
