The feast celebrates the great miracle of Purim when the Jewish people were rescued from wicked Haman's evil plans. Divine providence allowed Queen Esther to intervene and spoil Haman's plans, which led to the creation of the Purim Holiday.

Purim Sundae will be a Grand Purim Feast open to the Charlotte Jewish Community. The dinner is a family/child friendly menu, and will include Ice Cream Sundaes for dessert. This exciting event



will be held at Congregation Ohr HaTorah at 6 PM on Sunday, March 20. Prior to the dinner, at 5 PM, there will be an additional reading of the Megillah for anyone who missed the Sunday morning reading.
