## Young Tennis Ace Performing Well on the National Stage

Nationally ranked sixth-grade tennis player Daniel Belovs, 11, got a "late start," according to his father, Ivan Belovs, a former professional Russian hockey player. Daniel started playing tennis at 8.

"Most successful players in all sports start training hand-eye coordination from probably age 3," said Daniel's coach, Greg tennis for the Sandra and Leon Levine Jewish Community Center. Because Daniel is "very naturally athletic, he was able to develop and improve quickly.'

level," said Ivan Belovs.

Daniel is now making up for lost time. In the Boys 12-andunder division, he was ranked earlier this year at No. 230 nationally, No. 17 in North Carolina and No. 49 in the United States Tennis Association's Southern Section.

"The Southern Section is biggest section in the country," said Belovs. "It includes North South Carolina, Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, Tennessee, Kentucky and Arkansas."

Daniel is "quickly moving up all categories," said O'Connor. "During winter break, Daniel competed in the Junior Orange Bowl in Miami," said O'Connor. "This tournament hosts the best juniors from every continent of the globe. All the greats - including Andre Agassi, Jim Courier - have all competed in this tournament."

After the Junior Orange Bowl, Daniel traveled to Tucson, AZ, to compete in the USTA National Winter Championships. He defeated Ben Goldberg 7-5, 6-4 to win the Boys 12 Singles Consolation Southeast Draw.

Daniel was scheduled to play the USTA National Open Championships in Columbus, GA, on February 26-28 and plans to participate in the USTA BG 12 National Spring Championships at Delray Beach, FL, in April.

This is Daniel's first year being home-schooled. He has lessons

As a first-generation American, Daniel is fluent in Russian (his parents' native language) and English. He is also in the Duke University Talent Identification Program.

"At his age we are focused on technique so that he can be consistent with power and eventually start to develop some weapons that will serve him well as he gets older and starts competing for a college scholarship, or potentially a playing career," said
