For twenty-five years a reclusive American novelist has been writing at the desk she inherited from a young Chilean poet who disappeared at the hands of Pinochet's secret police. One day a girl claiming to be the poet's daughters arrives to take it away, send-ing the writer's life reeling.

The massive wooden desk provides the anchor to Krauss's masterful novel. Consisting of four stories divided among eight chapters and crossing decades and continents, the novel's characters, all tied to this mysterious desk, include the mysteriously vanished Chilean poet, an old man in Israel, an esteemed antiques dealer track ing down the things stolen from his father by the Nazis, and an American woman studying in Oxford

The highly praised Great ouse: A Novel, by Nicole House: Krauss, should lead to a stimulating and informative discussion at Temple Israel's November 15 Book Club meeting.

Copies of Great House are

available at the public library, the Levine-Sklut Jewish Library, at book stores and online for under \$15. Modern readers can also get a copy through Kindle.
