Holocaust Historian to Speak March 29 at Temple Beth El

World-renowned Holocaust winning study of life and death in historian Christopher Browning will speak at Temple Beth El on Thursday, March 29 at 7:30 PM on "Holocaust History and Survivor Testimony." The event is free and open to the public.

Browning will draw from his most recent book, Remembering Survival: Inside a Nazi Slave Labor Camp (2010), an awarda little-known Nazi slave-labor camp in Poland based on testimonies of some 300 survivors.

Browning is the Frank Porter Graham Professor of History at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He has been an expert witness at various trials of accused Nazi criminals in Australia, Canada and the United
