The students presented their preliminary findings at the prestigious Friedrich Meinecke Institute at the Free University in Berlin and at the Sosnowiec campus of Silesian University; they also met with Polish and German scholars, students, members of the Jewish community, politicians, a former Hitler Youth member, and a
