

### New Reform Congregation, Temple Solel, **Begins Services and Social Outreach**

Temple Solel, is set to have its inaugural Shabbat service on Friday, May 11, in York County, at the Recreation Complex at the ASC (formerly Leroy Springs Recreation Park), 971 Tom Hall Street, Fort Mill, SC at 7 PM. This service will mark the first Reform service held in York County. Services are scheduled to be held on the second Friday of every month with a social activity every fourth Friday.

Temple members have also begun social outreach projects in the community. We partnered with Unity Presbyterian Church in Ft. Mill and to build a bed to enter in the Make a Bed and Make a Difference Bed Race, on April 21 in Rock Hill.
