Founded in 1980, Jewish Family Services has evolved from an agency serving Jewish Russian immigrants, seniors, and the financially needy to one that provides a full range of counseling and social service assistance to the entire Greater Charlotte community.

Today, Jewish Family Services collaborates with every Jewish agency in our community, as well as many agencies throughout Charlotte. Family is the core of what JFS does and who we serve. As our slogan says, Jewish Family Services is "the heart of our community." But more than that, Family is the heart of Jewish Family Services.

JFS plays an integral part in the lives of countless families in the Charlotte area. From therapeutic groups for children experiencing

social issues, to counseling for the young adult starting out on a

life of independence, to parenting classes and workshops for families, to providing connections between senior adults and their out-of-town family members, JFS' positive and pervasive impact can be felt everywhere.

What is the Family to Family Campaign?

Funding for JFS programs and services are received through three primary sources: allocations from Jewish Federation of Greater Charlotte and program grants; client fees and insurance reimbursements; and contributions from our donors. Of these sources, over half of our \$750,000 budget is funded directly from contributions from our generous donors.

Donations to our annual campaign are used to set the budget for the next fiscal year, dictating the programs and services we are able to offer to the community. The generosity of our community makes it possible for Jewish Family Services to meet the growing numbers of those who seek our help.

"The economic reality of nonprofit agencies such as JFS is that insurance payments and client fees cover relatively little of the true cost to deliver the services our clients require and deserve," said Stephanie Starr, JFS Executive Director. Consequently, JFS turns to our community to make up the shortfall. "Ensuring that JFS continues to meet basic family needs, while retaining the flexibility to address emerging needs, is at the heart of the Family to Family annual campaign," Stephanie added.
