JCRC Fall Lecture to Feature CBS News Correspondent Dan Raviv

The Jewish Federation of Greater Charlotte's Community Relations Council (JCRC) welcomes Dan Raviv, Washington-based correspondent for CBS News and host of the national radio magazine *Weekend Roundup*, to Charlotte on Sunday, November 18, 7 PM in the Sam Lerner Center for Cultural Arts at Shalom Park. Raviv will be speaking about his new book "Spies Against Armageddon: Inside Israel's Secret Wars." Best-selling spy novelist Daniel Silva writes: "Buyer beware: Once you crack the cover of 'Spies Against Armageddon,' you won't be able to put it down. It is much more than simply the most authoritative book ever written about Israeli intelligence. It is storytelling and drama of the highest order."

When the World Trade Center was struck, Americans in

their cars and others listening to news radio were led through the shocking events of September 11 by the calm, clear and experienced voice of Dan Raviv. Hundreds of stations carried his live coverage for over eight hours that day, and he continues to anchor all the major events in the war against terrorism.

Dan Raviv's exciting, frank "you are there" style and incredible energy have thrilled lecture audiences from coast to coast. He has a unique ability to entertain and excite audiences, touching their hearts and minds with his own diverse experiences and a close-up view of America's challenges in the world.

For more than 20 years a foreign correspondent for CBS News on radio and television, he is now the Washington-based National Correspondent for the radio network, as well as a best-

selling author. His *Every Spy a Prince: The Complete History of Israel's Intelligence Community* was a national best-seller. His book, *Comic Wars*, is the full story of one of America's most contentious

business battles - the Marvel Comics bankruptcy. His newest book, "Spies Against Armageddon: Inside Israel's Secret Wars," was just released in July.

An expert on worldwide espionage and foreign affairs, Raviv has interviewed Olmert, Peres, Sharon, Barak, Netanyahu, Arafat, Mubarak, and all the major Middle East players. He was in Beirut at the U.S. Marine base destroyed by a suicide bomber; in Lockerbie just hours after the Pan Am jet was blown up; in Red Square with Reagan and Gorbachev; and in Poland, Ireland, Africa and Argentina with the Pope. Mr. Raviv is a veritable vault of

exciting stories, wrapped in an enthusiastic and charming personality.

Raviv will take questions after his lecture and will sign copies of his new book. The lecture is free and open to the public.

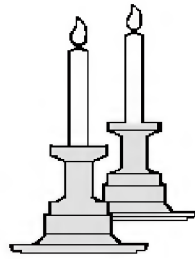
