# **Hungry Hearts** — A View of the Lower East Side

Be whisked back in time and see real footage of New York's Lower East Side in the 20s. The Jewish Film Society of Charlotte is proud to present this bittersweet, classic film that so beautifully captures the hopes and hardships of Jewish immigrants in the New World. Based on the short stories of Anzia Yezierska, the first writer to bring stories of American Jewish women to a mainstream audience, Hungry Hearts focuses on the Levine family who emigrate from Eastern Europe. While Abraham, the pious father, has difficulty making a living and adjusting to life in

America, his daughter Sara scrubs floors in the tenement in order to earn money and become "a somebody.'

The 1922, black-and-white film Hungry Hearts was directed by E. Mason Hopper and was filmed all on location on the Lower East Side. While this newly restored film is silent, live musical accompaniment will be featured for our Charlotte screening. Ethan Uslan, award-winning ragtime pianist, will provide the live music arranged solely for our viewing audience. This unique cultural experience is one that you won't want to miss.

### **Bereavement Support Group**

First and third Monday of each

month, starting November 4, 4-5:30 PM, JFS Conference Room

Our bereavement support group allows you to share your feelings with others who have experienced similar losses and are facing the same challenges. Led by JFS Clinical Therapist Lynda Woodburn, this new group is open to adults 18 and older who have experienced grief as a result of the death of a loved one. Through discussion topics and educational materials, you will have the opportunity to share your story in a safe and non-judgmental environment, and learn ways to understand your grief and explore avenues for growth and healing.

#### **Caregiver Support Group**

Now twice/month, the second Tuesday of each month at 6 PM and the fourth Tuesday at 10 AM (November 13 at 6 PM and November 27 at 10 AM).

Taking care of yourself is just as vital as taking care of your loved ones. JFS Clinical Therapist Nicole Levine and Director of Senior Adult Outreach Services Natalie Tunney lead caregivers for these confidential, safe meetings to explore your feelings and concerns.
