Erik Larson's best selling In the Garden of Beasts: Love, Terror, and an American Family in Hitler's Berlin is "a dazzling, addictively readable work that speaks volumes about why the world did not recognize the grave threat posed by Hitler until Berlin and Europe were awash in blood and terror." This work of novelis-tic history focuses on the family of William E. Dodd, who in 1933 became the first ambassador to Hitler's Germany. Though Dodd's flamboyant daughter Martha, is at first intrigued by the handsome young men of the Third Reich and their enthusiasm for restoring Germany to a position of world prominence, the rising incidents of Jewish persecution deeply concern Dodd and he telegraphs these concerns to the US state department but to no avail.

In the Garden of Beasts is sure to enlighten readers about this critical time in world history and, in particular, why the world did not recognize this "gathering storm."

The second November book club event on Thursday, November 29 is co-sponsored with Sisterhood. One More River by Mary Glickman is the sweeping story of a father and son, and of the loves that transform them amid the turbulence of the American South. Mickey Moe in 1962 travels up and down the Mississippi River to discover the gripping details of his father's life. This journey, taken at the dawn of the civil rights era, leads him deep into the backwoods of Mississippi and Tennessee, where he meets with danger and unexpected revelations at every turn. Only four years old when his father died, Mickey Moe is now a grown man, who must prove his pedigree to the disapproving parents of his

girlfriend to win her hand in marriage.

Both award-winning books are available at the Levine-Sklut Judaic Library and public libraries and at book stores or on-line for less than \$15. *One More River* is also available at the Temple Israel gift shop.
