Nationally Known Scribe and Artist Neil Yerman to Visit Temple Or Olam

The first obligations of any Jewish community are to have a place to honor and bury their dead

and to possess a handwritten Torah scroll, which contains the Five Books of Moses. The scroll is the only ritual item that is essential to Jewish communal existence. Every child chants from it to mark the passage to adulthood, adults hold it high, carry it, and

kiss its mantle as it passes by. There is no object more central to Jewish worship than the Torah.

though Even Cabarrus County's first and only Jewish congregation has fewer than 40 families, we now find ourselves in possession of two different Torahs that deeply connect us to the faith and the sufferings of past congregations far away.

Most Torahs are written by one scribe ("sofer" in Hebrew). Temple Or Olam's first Torah was written at least a century ago by at least four scribes who came from Moravia, Macedonia, and Eastern Europe. Fragments written by each of these scribes were stitched together to make one scroll sometime in the middle of the last century – likely just after WWII. The many communities who produced them were destroyed in the Holocaust. Somehow these fragments survived. And the Torah made from the remnants ended up in North Carolina – first in Weldon, now in Concord.

Coming to Temple Or Olam on November 18, the second scroll, which uses Sephardi script, was likely written in Iraq or Iran around the time that the modern nation of Israel was founded. Many Jewish communities in

> those countries were forced to dissolve in retaliation for that event.

To both fund and celebrate the arrival of the new Torah, we are hosting a major interfaith event — another first for Cabarrus County. Nationally known scribe and artist Neil Yerman will speak to interested

people of all faiths on "The Five Books of Moses – First Edition."

Why an interfaith event for something that is so essential to Judaism? Because both these Torahs represent hope after despair. Together, they represent the diversity of the Jewish people. Despite the painful past they survived, learning about these scrolls can be a pathway to future understanding between religious tradi-

If you are interested in attending this interfaith, family-friendly event (Sofer Yerman is fabulous with children; they are encouraged to participate in the presentation), tickets are available for purchase through PayPal or by mail at \$10 each. Children under 12 are free. Proceeds from the event will act as tax-deductible donations to our congregation's Torah fund, and we will be very grateful for your support.

The event will take place at 2 PM on November 18 at McGill Baptist Church, 5300 Poplar Tent Rd., Concord, NC.
