As Jews, we observe many milestones - brit milah, bar/bat mitzvah, confirmation, marriage, and death. The 70th birthday is different. In Psalm 90, the phrase "the days of our years are threescore years and ten" is used to describe human lifespan; thus, we celebrate the 70th birthday as a full life, and at age 83 we celebrate a second bar/bat mitz-
